PURPOSE:

To outline the process for the election of the Chair and Vice Chair positions of the North Red Deer River Water Services Commission

BACKGROUND:

Section 4.4 of the Commission's Bylaw #1 requires the election of the position of Chair and Vice Chair. With the retirement of both the Chair and Vice Chair, both positions are currently vacant.

The Chair is responsible for the management of the quarterly Board meetings and to call special meetings if required. The Vice Chair's role is to fill in in the absence of the Chair. Both positions are signing officers for the Commission.

ISSUE ANALYSIS:

With the retirements of both the Chair and Vice Chair, Board member Mark Matejka was appointed acting Chair at the last Board meeting. Acting Chair Matejka will oversee the November 6, 2017 meeting until the elections are complete, at which time the newly elected Board Chair will assume chairing the meeting.

There are no specific election rules outlined in the bylaws of the Commission, therefore, Administration is recommending that the election process outlined in the Robert's Rules of Order be followed. The election would go as follows:

- 1. Acting Chair calls for nominations from the floor for the position of the Chair.
- 2. Once all the nominations have been received from the floor, the Acting Chair closes nominations. Board member should not nominate themselves.
- 3. If more than one name is put forth for the position of the Chair, then the Acting Chair will call for a vote by show of hands for each candidate.
- 4. The candidate with the most votes will be declared the elected Chair for the year.
- 5. If only one name is received that person will be acclaimed as Chair for the year.

The same process would be followed for the election of the Vice Chair position.

Operations Report

Mr. Huston discussed the recent operation activities.

In summary:

- The Alberta One-Call locate requests are at average for this time of the year.
- Operations responded to a few repair issues, with one being a flow issue at the main vault. A reset of the system corrected the issue.
- Working with Blackfalds to move a feeder line to facilitate a road realignment.
 Coordinating with Ponoka and Telus who are installing a new fiber optic line in the Town of Ponoka and crossing the regional line.
- Operations Lead Operator retired earlier this year; the vacant position has been filled.
- The SCADA program had been delayed due to summer holidays and the vacant operator position. On September 12, 2017, the program kicked off with a full line tour scheduled for September 25, 2017.

Administrator Report

Mr. Minchin presented the Administrator's report.

In summary:

- Attended the annual planning meeting with Red Deer. Discussed Red Deer's upcoming capital projects.
- The Commission has not received the confirmed 2018 supply water rate from the City of Red Deer.
- The City of Lacombe and Lacombe County are in discussions regarding the sale of water. NRDRWSC Administrator has created a MOU to facilitate the service.
- Still working with Red Deer on the purchase of the part of the waterline.

Mr. Minchin presented the financial report.

In summary:

- Set records for water sales in July. Sales are slightly over target for year to date. Still lower than the past two years.
- Set conservative water sales goals for 2018.

Chairperson's Report

The Chair has been assisting Administration with the communication to Red Deer on the sale and purchase of the waterline.

7. Old Business:

City of Red Deer Waterline Sale

Mr. Minchin provided an update on the status of the discussions regarding the potential sale of a portion of the Commission's water line that lies within the corporate boundaries of the City of Red Deer. The City of Red Deer has identified a number of options for the Commission to consider. Administration will have to review those options and the impact on future water rates. The Commission will also have to abide with the rules established by the Province on the disposal of Commission assets. Further discussions will occur with the new Commission Board after the 2017 municipal elections.

MOVED by Councillor Wigmore to accept reports as information.

8. New Business:

MOA - NRDRWSC City of Lacombe and Lacombe County

Mr. Minchin presented a draft copy of the Memorandum of Agreement to the Commission for the City of Lacombe to supply water to Lacombe County west of Highway 2. The agreement is necessary to ensure that this water is applied against the County's water allocation with the Commission. A similar request was approved to facilitate supplying the County via Blackfalds.

MOVED by Councillor Poole to approve the Memorandum of Agreement between the City of Lacombe, Lacombe County and the North Red Deer River Water Services Commission for the supply of water to Lacombe County.

Draft 2018 Operating Budget

Mr. Minchin presented the draft 2018 Operating Budget to the Commission for consideration. The preliminary budget is based on a 5% increase in water rates from the City of Red Deer. This is estimate from Commission Administration. Administration should received the actual water rate by mid to end of October. A 2% increase in Commission rates has been proposed. The first increase in 5 years.

No major projects have been included. Should the SCADA project proceed, Administration will look to absorb initial operating costs within the proposed rate increase.

A copy of the draft budget will be sent to the respective councils for comments or concerns and asked to advise the Commission if any before the November 6th meeting.

MOVED by Councillor Wigmore to accept the draft 2018 Operating Budget as information.

Appointment of Acting Chair/Signing Authority

Mr. Minchin stated that with the retirement of both the Chair and Vice Chair in October that the Commission should consider appointing Mark Matejka as the Acting Chair. Mr. Matejka is the only existing board member to be acclaimed in their respective municipal council position. The acting Chair is for emergency purposes and cheque signing should there be any. This appointment will only be in place until a permanent appointment of a Chair and Vice Chari is made at the November 6, 2017 meeting.

MOVED by Mayor Rick Bonnett that the North Red Deer River Water Services Commission appoint Mark Matejka as Acting Chair for the period effective October 23, 2017 to November 6, 2017 as the Commission representative, giving him authority to act on the Commission's behalf for signing cheques, authorizing invoices, executing agreements, or other matters in which the Commission's interests are represented.

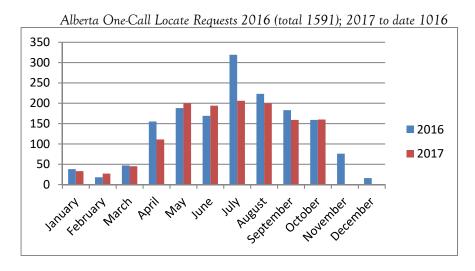

Repair response charges:

- October 6 Operator inspected the air release chambers from Lacombe to Red Deer, noting condition, water infiltration and general access to the chambers for future maintenance.
- October 16 & 17 Operator and Endress+Hauser performed water meter verification testing on all meters, except 39th Ave & Main Vault. Initial scheduling left out these two meters due to being a different brand. Endress+Hauser technician confirmed that they can also test third party water meters. These two meters will be added to the City of Lacombe's testing in 2018. All meters tested were verified to be compliant and accurate.

General Information:

- ➤ Operator worked with Northside Construction and Urban Dirt Works with the relocation of a branch (service) line to Railway reservoir.
- ➤ Operator continues to work with the various contractors on the regional wastewater line from Lacombe to Red Deer that are digging in vicinity or are crossing the regional water line.

Attached is the 2017 variance report as of September 30th, 2017 for the regional water commission.

Water sales remain on track to exceed 2018 budget amounts, although volumes will remain at or below the 5 year trending average.

Expenses remain in line with expectations. No extraordinary expenses have been incurred. Costs for SCADA review are yet to be billed as the project remains a work in progress. As the year end approaches, transfers from reserves and billing to county members will take place.

The projected surplus to the end of the year is currently at \$135,830 compared to a budgeted surplus of \$70,579. The difference is the result of higher than budgeted water sales.

2018 Operating Budget

The North Red Deer River Water Services Commission transports potable water from the City of Red Deer to its member municipalities. Currently, the Commission delivers water to all its members. The 2018 budget forecasts revenues based on the water demand estimates provided by the member municipalities. The largest costs to the Commission are the purchase of water from the City of Red Deer and debenture payments.

The following is a summary of changes included in the 2018 operating budget followed by the budget itself.

Water Costs

The 2018 operating budget is based on a 5% increase in water rates from the City of Red Deer. The projected rate from the City of Red Deer is expected to increase from \$1.38 to \$1.45 per cubic metre effective March 1st, 2018. The Commission is waiting a formal estimate from the City which is expected in October. The details of the rate and impact on the budget are outlined on page 3.

Water Sales Volumes

Water sales volumes for 2018 have been increased slightly from the estimates from the 2017 budget. Actual consumption for 2017 was slightly lower than forecasted and Administration is forecasting slower growth in the coming years. Included in the estimate is a change to the water loss estimate. Water forecasts are outlined in page 4 of this document.

Other Operating Revenues and Expenditures

In addition to water purchases and sales volume estimate adjustments, Administration has also reviewed all expenses for the Commission and made a number of adjustments. The following is a summary of those adjustments. The operating budget starts on page 5.

Revenues

- 1. Adjust revenue from City of Red Deer to reflect projected water volumes and delivery charges. Cost of water is not charged to the Commission and therefore a lower rate is passed on to the City for Central Park. This change results in a reduction in revenue estimate of \$29,850. An offsetting charge to water costs to the Commission has also been made.
- 2. Increase in line crossing fees of \$500 to reflect growing income.
- 3. Increase of \$6,489 in interest revenue to reflect growing cash balances.

Expenses

- 4. Increase in Board travel and mileage of \$250 to reflect change in Board membership.
- 5. Increase of \$100 in Administration travel to cover miscellaneous travel, if required.
- 6. Increase in \$300 in Volunteer recognition for retiring board members in 2018.
- 7. Increase in Telephone Office of \$680 to replace phone.
- 8. Increase of Management Fees based on a January 1st increase. A \$1,116 increase.
- 9. Decrease in Other Professional Services of \$30,000 to recognize completion of SCADA review.
- 10. Increase in Equipment Maintenance costs of \$2,000 to reflect ongoing maintenance costs.

Page

- 11. Increase in SCADA costs to reflect monthly rate increase. Annual increase of \$725.
- 12. Increase Administration (accounting services) based on a January 1st increase of \$204.
- 13. Water purchases are based on projected water volumes and the new City of Red Deer rate.
- 14. Increase in Operations costs to reflect increased rates effective January 1st from \$121,300 to \$123,637 (\$2,337 increase).
- 15. No Change in electricity costs to factor in additional carbon tax increases in 2018.
- 16. Amortization remains unchanged. As this is a non-cash expense, the reserve policy will see this transferred to capital reserves at the end of the year in 2018.
- 17. Funding from rate stabilization reserve of \$215,000 to offset rate increase from City as per 5 year plan.
- 18. The operating surplus has been reduced to make up the increase in water rates from the City. The projected operating surplus has been reduced from 125,000 to 117,213 a reduction of \$7,787. The Commission will still access \$215,000 from the stabilization reserve.
- 19. There are no operating costs yet associated with the SCADA project. Capital installation is expected in 2018 with additional costs possible in mid 2018. The Commission's final draft would include this costs within the proposed rate increase.

Water Rates

Based on the projected 5% increase from the City of Red Deer, Administration is proposing a rate of increase of 1.97% effective March 1, 2018. The rate would increase for the first time since 2013 from \$2.03 to \$2.07 per cubic metre. This rate increase could be adjusted lower based on final City of Red Deer water rate and possible SCADA operating costs.

2018 Capital Budget

The only proposed project for 2018 is the SCADA project. An initial estimate of \$200,000 is proposed funded from the Commission's Capital Reserves. The final estimate will be presented at the November Board meeting along with possible operating cost implications.

Purpose

To present to the Board for discussion the first draft of the Commission's 2018-2022 Operational Budget.

Background

Administration has prepared an updated 5 year operations budget for the Regional Water Services Commission. This document is intended to provide the Board with a projection of the expected operations of the Commission for the period 2018-2022. The document is a planning document and is the basis for the 2018 operating budget.

This document is the first draft and incorporates the most recent estimate from the City of Red Deer for the previous 2017-2021 period.

The document is 3 pages. The first page outlines the cost escalators and projected City of Red Deer water rates. Page 2 outlines the forecasted water volumes for the Commission. Page 3 outlines the projected budget for the next 5 years.

Issue Analysis

The projections have been prepared based on the following assumptions:

- Water forecasts based on slower water growth from previous years due to slower development growth. Impact of operations of new regional waste water line on demand for water has not yet been factored in, although sales growth for Lacombe and Blackfalds has been reduced by 1% per year.
- 2. Water loss based on 1% annual growth
- 3. Water forecast done on year by year basis.
- 4. City rate applied based on an average monthly consumption for first two months (non-seasonally adjusted).
- 5. City of Red Deer rates based on projections provided by the City.
- 6. Operations based on current customer base and current asset inventory.

- 7. Application of known true up reserves including true up revenue received in 2016.
- 8. No change to debt payments.
- 9. Maintain annual operating surplus of \$100,000 to \$125,000 per year.
- 10. Include projected City of Red Deer water revenue for 2018 to 2022.
- 11. Impact of potential sale of a portion of line to the City is not yet factored in.

Administration is awaiting an updated 5 year rate projection from the City and is using most recent information from the City.

The plan itself calls for very stable rates over the next five years. This is due to increasing water demand and stable non water supply costs. The plan maintains a projected surplus of \$117,000 annually that could be applied against future rate increases and/or offset lower than expected water sales. The target is for a 2% annual increase over the next 5 years.

Given the projected water rate increases from the City, the Commission's rate is expected to increase starting in 2018 even with the application of true up reserves.

<u>Alternatives</u>

1. The report is prepared for information. Administration is seeking input from the Board on any possible changes. No other alternatives are proposed at this time.
